We are hopeful we will hear about training by next week and have all in place to begin the first week of November.

*Money Mentors: dates and times have been planned with the school to begin Virtually in November. FCSS Program Coordinator Elizabeth plans to be in classrooms with the students if possible and online, if not.

*Facilitated Presentations from Leading Change Community Developer Alberta Council of Women 39s Shelters have been planned for November 2nd & and 3rd for the High School Students. These Virtual Sessions are joint sessions with the Innisfree Delnorte School. The Designed programs support students to lead from where they stand in addressing domestic violence. Sessions are based on the following: Understanding Domestic Violence, Thinking Outside the "Real Man" Box; Bystander Awareness and Action and Understanding Consent. Each student will receive a Leading Change Expansion Pack.

*Plans are underway for a Teen Drop-In Program. Please encourage your youth to stop by talking with Elizabeth about what that could look like, identifying needs and social issues.

Program possibilities: Build relationships, hear presentations from like-minded facilitators: engage in volunteer opportunities and perhaps this will lead to involvement on a Youth Council. Youth Council is an entity composed of young people that serves as an advisory or advocacy body to government or donor agencies. Most often, its role is to identify priorities, craft policies that support these priorities, and contribute to the implementation of these policies through public services.

Restorative Circle Purpose of Supportive & Restorative Circle Project: Goodlife Collective

- FCSS is excited to continue with the Restorative Circle project in the schools with Good Life Collective. We have budgeted to present this project from Mid January to mid June and then again mid Sept to mid December. We are hopeful for a continuation into the next budget cycle in 2023, however that is dependant upon the Provincial Budget.
- This project is **students and their supports** centered and preventative in nature. It provides programming for those dealing with emotional difficulties covering a wide range of problem areas. Restorative Circles have been utilized for centuries as a way to reconnect people, allow space for empathy to be built, and build skills for difficult conversations. Circles can be used in small, targeted formats, to seek to improve a particular concern, or can be used in a broader larger group setting to increase feelings of openness and connectivity. Over the past years, Circles have been found to be increasingly effective in educational settings, for both students, staff, and families. The aim of this project is to allow space for targeted Circles, as well as consult and empower staff to continue to build their skills in this capacity. What is typically seen as a direct result, is more open and empathetic communication within schools. **Program Objectives:** The focus of the program will be to provide support to empower **students and their supports** to improve resilience and to function to their potential.
- Meaning of this phrase Students and their supports: Good Life Collective may engage those supports who are valuable in a students day to day life: teachers, assistants, parents and caregiver.

8. School Trustee Report- Read by Andrea Cassibo

By-Election Day for Ward 4, Subdivision 3 is Saturday September 10, 2022. Nomination Day is Friday August 19, 2022

Budget for the year ending Aug 31, 2023 is now online for viewing. It is under the "About/Reports" on the website. May 20 all guardians should have received an email from BTPS notifying of this. I have attached a copy of this letter for reference. Some highlights of the budget:

- Alberta Ed has given 48,130,137 which includes 1,726,068 of Bridge/COVID mitigation funding.
- Overall decrease to BTPS base funding, services and supports and community funding from Alberta Ed

- o 73% of funding is directed to K-12 students, 11% to operation and maintenance, 12% to Transportation, and 4% to governance and admin.
- Our student-teacher ration is 16-1 (one of the best in the province)
- o Increase in: Operations and Maint of \$400,000 and Transportation \$400,000.

As said before, no surplus is held in our transportation budget, therefore a motion was carried to allot a one time payment for the 2021-2022 year of 12 cents/km to each bus for this year. We hope this can offset some of the significant rise in fuel costs to them. (this is based on the km the route drives so it is equitable to all).

Our Transport budget went up 4% for the next year. That money will provide an increase to our contractors for the next year 2022/23.

The board addressed the cross jurisdiction/boundary exemption requests that were submitted. A total of 16 were submitted to BTPS this year.

The board carried a motion to reduce school fees for the 2022-2023 year from \$120 to \$60. Hoping to assistance guardians to relieve some financial pressures. This is addressed each year based on budget, and funding provided to BTPS by Alberta Ed.

4 year ed plan presented by Assistance Superintendent Trodden. This document is submitted to Alberta Education for the Division and can be found on the website. It collects data from all stakeholders, as well as our students within the Division. It identifies priorities for the coming year, to improve student learning.

May 18 at 7pm, BTPS held an online engagement forum regarding the curriculum. Very few stakeholders tuned in, however it was recorded for those who could not make it. It focused on the big 3: effective planning, instruction, and practices. This is a process, not a one-time event, and even though the learning has changed, the way leaning happens has not.
