School Council: Thank you for the opportunity to attend the School Council meetings. It is our hope that one of our staff will be available to attend each meeting in our FCSS/FRN capacity to provide an update of programs and to gather insight as to the needs of students, families and school itself. #### School Based Prevention Programs:

FCSS staff met with principals of both Mannville and Innisfree schools, VIBE programmer and Good Life Collective – Jamie Knight at the end of August to discuss past and future programs.

Restorative Circle: This project, funded by FCSS, and presented by Good Life Collective, will continue to provide support to empower students and their supports to improve resilience and to function to their full potential. School Council Speaking notes from our September Meeting:

- -Dual credit program 150,000 grant. Automotive and University Transfer Credits. About 7000/course plus books. Target of Grade 12's, total of 12 students from Division. Rest of money going to development of the UT credit courses more fully.
- -Some of the UT courses are: Developmental Psy, Nuero psy, Positive psy, abnormal psy, advanced psy, and study of well being.
- -We are completing the approval process with Alberta ED to allow for instruction in our schools.
- -Staffing report in our division. Teachers- 232 as of Sept 15. Support staff as of June 2022 is 198.
- -October were told we will receive funds to address gr 1-3 literacy and numeracy learning loss. What we know from our Division assessments:

Grade 1: 330 total in Division, intervention 34.8% down to 16.5%

Grade 2: 291 total in Division 33.9% down to 14.9 %.

Grade 3: 287 total in Division.from 37.3% to 20.7%

- -So far have got: 240,928 from the grant we first applied for, all this has been given out to the schools on a needs basis.
- -4 Year Education plan will begin. Division will meet with Leadership, Staff, and the Board to develop the new 4 year ed plan. Please look for stakeholder engagement opportunities that will be happening in the upcoming year.
- -Try a Trade is BACK- April 26 for Grade 10's! Board financially supports this opportunity for our students.
- -Offer was accepted for Reyonalds for Clandonald School.
- -Projects completed over the summer:

- -Innisfree: Aspalt and all weather upgrade, gym floors.
- -We held our organizational meeting on Sept 21. I will be serving as board chair this year, as well as the Negotiations Committee and Joint Transportation Committee.

#### \*Celebration items:

October 5- BTPS will be hosting a Celebration Event in person finally, to recognize long service and retirement in our Division. There are over 100 recipients of awards for this evening, and the board looks forward to hosting it for the staff.

- -IRMA STUDENT- Natalie Heimdal won the 2022 Martyn Godfry young Writers Aware presented by the young alberta book writers.
- -Want to make note and attention to our: Learning on the Trail podcast on the website, under the about tab. Here we have 3 podcasts on Gender Awareness, Learning about Writes, and Learn about Artists of Symbolic Indigenous Art. The podcast seeks to schedule a variety of people to share information with our students and stakeholders about opportunities available. And our Superintendent highlights special guests on a variety of diverse topics for our students. We are thankful to our leadership in our Division who have set this as a priority.

School reviews No schools to be reviewed this school year. Innisfree is on the watchlist, Mannville is not.

Shared by Kim:

Mannville: 192 students 1-12, 14 in K. Division 1-25%, Division 2-29%, Division 3-28%, Division 4-19%

Enrollment trends: 216 in 2021-21 that was the highest in last 5 years. Last year 206.

Highschool VR: Sending 0 out, Receiving 6. 28 core credits offered to students.

School Utilization: 46%

Notes: School utilization is low, can have double the school population of now. Enrollment consistent. Lowest enrollment is in division 4 with 19%. Increasing drop out rate. Receiving 6 DL courses. Facility updates this year were the boiler room, concrete pad removal & replacement and flooring replacement.

Last year as a school division Alberta Ed held us "harmless" with the new WMA funding model, and gave us 2.1 million. Without this funding the new WMA model would have seen our budget decrease substantially.

Met with MLA Roswell and had discussions with him on rural education needs: transport, mental health and professional services, funding. Facilities needing upgrades that have been on the capital plan since 2002-WES. Strong, stainable, vibrant communities. MLA Roswell is chair for the North rural schools committee. Board is invested in continuing to advocate with our MLAS in our division, and with the help of the Rural Cacus of Alberta, ABSA, PSBAA to bring forth concerns to our government.

Our Superintendent has been invited to meet with the Deputy Minister of Education and will do so on Dec 15. She will be bringing forth the same topics that the board has already discussed with the Minister, as well as MLAs.

Audited Financial Statement was approved by the board. It will be available online for viewing.

AERR- Annual Education Results Report 2021-2022. It highlights our division foundational statements, enrollment across the Division, Areas of Strength and growth as well as web links to our current 4 year plan, 2022/23 budget, 2022/23 capital plan, 2021/22 financial statements and the assurance dashboard 2022.

Dates for upcoming 4 year planning engagement session:

Jan 18-provost, Jan 19 Wainwright, Jan 25 Kitscoty, Jan 26 Vermilion, and Feb 1 online all at 630pm.

More dates to take note of: Our public meeting in Feb will be the 14th (moved from the 21st) and March 14 (moved from the 21 as well).

The board has been touring our Division schools and colony schools. So far we have attended: Wainwright elementary, Dewberry, Marwayne, South Ferriby Colony, Paradise Valley, KES and KHS. We will be touring more in Jan, Feb and finishing all schools in March.

Social emotional coaches: After going through instructional budgets we have some dollars remaining – funds that are designated to students. Our board wants to put this years dollars to this years students. Principals and guardians as well as students have indicated that there is a strong need for more supports. There are now 2 FTE postings, one for N and one S for our division. This is in addition to supports already in place.

Additional notes that have been made public by Alberta Ed.

\$ 112,533 awarded by Alberta Ed for learning disruption. Our Assist. Superintendent will be working with leadership and central office on this. ( this is public knowledge)

Mental health pilot projects- we did get this awarded as well to our Division. Ariel Haubrich and WOW – separate from what exists with other schools, will be for the next 2 years funded to our Provost, Amik, Hughenden, Chauvin, and Edgerton Schools. These schools do NOT currently have VIVE or WOW.






