Sept 20 is our next board meeting 930 Wainwright- all welcome to attend as always.

Attendance numbers first week: 222 for Mannville total in Division 3659 (down from what we projected but these numbers will shift as registrations finalize by the month's end).

Outstanding Support Staff Award: Eligible staff: currently BTPS staff member, been employed for at least the last 2 years in any school, be an eligible member of CUPE, not won this award in the past. Has to be the individual, not a staff team.

CAN BE NOMINATED BE A PARENT OF A STUDENT CURRENTLY ENROLLED in BTPS.

Sept 30 is the cut off and the application is posted on the website this year.

Wainwright Elementary School- Sept 14 Sr leadership meeting with the government, and the engineer for the project. We will be bringing into the conversations on the project: staff, students, and welcome input from the Rotary Club, the town of Wainwright and along the way Wainright Day care as well. As of right now there is no design to have modulars as part of this build it will be just a building which is welcome news as modular date easily, lots of wear and tear and have many issues with plumbing/heating which we've seen in past builds. Same design/engineer as Irma and Paradise Valley builds.

Mannville School (IMR/CMR projects)

LED Lightening upgrade to some of the school during summer. Expensive to do so it has been chunked out to complete.

Gym Floor was refinished

Roof upgrade over the 4-6 exit as it was leaking.

All weather surface now dealt with.

As a note- Whenever possible the board asks our facilities to utilize local contractors for work to be done. Student Exit Survey- done each year. 55 reported back to the Division and completed the survey. 19

moved away, and 14 registered in other BTPS schools.

Other 22 sited reasons of: programming, moving to home learning, difficulties with peer, staff

interactions.

Of these 22: 13% of them talked to someone at the school before leaving, and 71% did not.

Action from Division: To share surveys with principals to help with assurance planning, and increase in

year reviews to see if parents/school need support with any issues.
