Mannville School is a K-12 school providing education for students in the Mannville community and surrounding area. Serving approximately 200 students, with a staff of 13 teachers. We are very proud of all our ROYALS and we endeavor to support all of our students to achieve success in their academics, athletics, and ultimately for their lives as lifelong learners. It is our goal that along with teaching academics, we foster students' development in their relationships, identity, emotional skills, and overall well-being.

Mannville School offers a variety of programming that maximizes student learning. 
Mannville School has used student feedback and survey responses to guide programming related to grade 7-9 CTF programming.


The Learning Hub provides programming for 6 students in a variety of high school course options.


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
Grades 7-12: Mannville School




Mannville School incorporates literacy blocks into the elementary timetable to foster and promote the development of literacy skills.


Mannville School Assurance Dashboard Overview




Grade 6 Local Results: Percentage of students achieving Acceptable Standard on Provincial Achievement Tests







- Monthly opportunities for Mannville School staff to work directly with the BTPS Innovation Coaches on new curriculum and resources available to K-6 teachers.





Students who have intense feelings of fear, intense anxiety, or worry about particular events or social situations.


- 37% of students in this school had moderate to high levels of anxiety; the Canadian norm for these grades is 22%.
- 42% of the girls and 31% of the boys in this school had moderate to high levels of anxiety. The Canadian norm for girls is 26% and for boys is 18%.




Grade 7-12: Students with moderate or high levels of depression

Students with moderate or high levels of depression
Students who have prolonged periods when they feel sad, discouraged, and inadequate.

- 29% of students in this school had moderate to high levels of depression; the Canadian norm for these grades is 24%.
- 32% of the girls and 24% of the boys in this school had moderate to high levels of depression. The Canadian norm for girls is 31% and for boys is 16%.




Grade 7-12: Students with a positive self-esteem



Students who like and accept themselves, and are proud of their accomplishments.

- 64% of students in this school had high self-esteem; the Canadian norm for these grades is 73%.
- 61% of the girls and 68% of the boys in this school had high self-esteem. The Canadian norm for girls is 68% and for boys is 79%.








Grade 7-12 Our School Survey Results:

Mannville School will provide a range of in-school support in collaboration with outside services to ensure students are learning in inclusive and safe spaces. The range of supports includes, but is not limited to:


